NOVEMBER 4, 2025 LOCAL GENERAL ELECTION NEWS

The Local General Election will be held Tuesday, November 4, 2025. The polling location for city residents is the Ithaca Community Center located at 120 N. Maple Street, Ithaca. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Any person in line at 8:00 p.m. will be allowed to vote.

•**Not registered to vote and want to vote in this election?** You must go in person to the City Clerk's office as soon as possible but not later than 8:00 p.m. on election day. Proof of residency is required and photo ID should be presented. A voter who registers to vote on Election Day by appearing in-person at the City Clerks Office, in City Hall, with valid proof of residency, is also eligible to obtain an absent voter ballot until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.



•**Already registered, but changing your address?** You have three options:

- 1) You must go to the City Clerk's office and bring a document showing proof of residency. (Driver's license, paycheck, bank statement, current utility bill or another government document)
- 2) Vote at your old voting location one more time.
- 3) Request an absent voter ballot from your old city or township clerk .

•**Absentee Ballots are available** at City Hall, by mail-in or on-line application at Michigan.gov/vote.

City Hall hours are 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday, Special hours: Saturday, November 1, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and November 4, 2025 from 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. Please bring photo ID. The deadline to obtain an absentee ballot online or by mail is 5:00 p.m. on November 1st or in person at the Clerk's office up until 4:00 p.m. on November 4, 2025. Absentee ballots must be returned by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. Election Drop Box is available at City Hall, 129 W. Emerson Street, Ithaca.

•**Early Voting** There is no early voting for Local Elections. Michigan Election Law requires Early Voting for State and Federal Elections only.

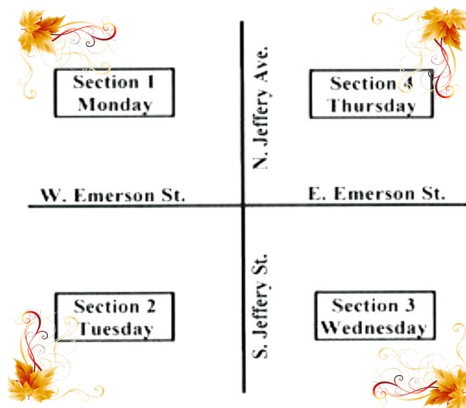

The leaves are beginning to fall. Curbside leaf pickup will begin mid to late October and run through November, weather permitting. Please rake leaves into a wind row along the edge of the street on the night before your scheduled pickup. (Please do not put the leaves directly on the street or sidewalk.) Any leaf piles that contain **grass clippings, walnuts, sticks or other debris** will not be picked up as they plug up the leaf vacuum. For brush and tree limbs, the City maintains a brush pile located at the east end of Meadow Lane that is free to City residents.



Consider helping a neighbor if they do not have the means to take brush to the brush pile.

As of September 4, 2023, residents are no longer allowed to burn leaves or yard waste. **City of Ithaca Ordinance No. 2023-02; Chapter 16: Fire Prevention and Protections; Article II; Burning: § 16-33 Leaves, Grass Clippings, Dead Grass, Hedges, Weeds.** No person shall burn or cause to be burned the following types of materials: leaves, grass clippings, hedges, weeds and other similar types of materials.

With winter weather being around the corner, we are starting to prepare for the snow and ice. The DPW Crew starts plowing and salting the streets during the early hours of the morning. The priority order for clearing snow are the major streets, local streets, downtown and city buildings, alleys and clearing snow piles out of intersections. When possible, the City will assist with clearing sidewalks when there is 6 inches of snow or more.

City ordinance states that no vehicle can be parked on the streets during the hours of 2:00 AM to 5:00 AM year around. We appreciate your cooperation.
