~CITY OF ITHACA AND OUR BEAUTIFUL PARKS~ ,



As we enter into our warmer months in Michigan, I wanted to remind everyone what the City of Ithaca has to offer in our parks.

We are in the final year of our Parks and Recreation Plan and will be working to develop a new five-year plan later this year. Resident input is welcomed and encouraged; we will have a survey circulating for your input sometime this summer. Two items the city is looking into is funding for the Woodland Park Road and a new Playscape. The current structure is twenty years old and is showing its' age. If you are interested in spearheading or joining a group of volunteers to raise awareness and funding for a new one, please contact us at City Hall.

In the meantime, please enjoy the coming months and what our many parks have to offer.

Atkinson Park is located at the corner of Edgar St. and E. North St, adjacent to the Senior Activity Building. It is a 3.9-acre neighborhood park that houses a pavilion, picnic tables, a walking path, horse shoe pits and shuffleboard. The newest addition to the park area are the pickle ball courts that were built in 2022 and have already begun attracting residents and visitors alike. The courts are open to players of all ages and skill level.

Memory Park is our newest park and is nestled in the downtown block on the South side of Center Street. Not only does this park host our annual Christmas tree lighting, but is the ideal spot for a break while walking through downtown and visiting your favorite shop or restaurant. The Ithaca Promotional Committee funded a beautiful light canopy overhanging the park, this past year. You should see more events coming to Memory Park in the near future featuring this light canopy.

McNabb Park is our largest park at 164.4 acres. McNabb is home to a Pig/Calf scramble during spring time and the Gratiot Agricultural Society's Ag Expo every June. The posse arena even hosted a Saginaw Valley State University Equestrian competition in 2022. A portion of the park is utilized by AYSO 1163 youth soccer leagues in the spring and fall. The park also boasts the Jail House trail, a combination of mountain biking and walking trails on the South West 43 acres of the property. And, after a short hiatus the Gratiot County Chamber of Commerce is bringing back the Agri-Fit Challenge to McNabb Park this Fall.

Woodland Park is a 22.5-acre gem near the western border of our city. While the park may be best known for having the only Winter Sled Hill in Gratiot County, it has many other features to offer our community. There is a 1-mile walking trail circling the park, and near the entrance of the park is a large pavilion for family gatherings. You will also find smaller pavilions scattered throughout the park for picnics and parties. They can be reserved at City Hall or are available on a first come first serve basis. An amphitheater sits in the middle of the park and on the South West edge there is a dog park for your furry friends. The aforementioned Playscape has been a staple of Woodland Park for our children during the past twenty years. We do hope to have a new one in the coming years for the next generation of youth.

These were just some of the highlights of our community parks. We invite everyone to get out and enjoy them!

Board and Commission Vacancies



If you would like to give a few hours of your time and expertise, we would like to hear from you! The people of Ithaca are what make this a great community and help it to run efficiently. The City is currently accepting applications for appointment to the following Boards and Commissions:

- ▶ Planning Commission- (3-year term) Meets the 2nd Tuesday of the Month (as needed).
- ▶ Board of Review- (3-year term) Meets in March, July and December.
- ▶ Downtown Development Authority (4-year term) Meets 2nd Monday in April, June, September and December.

Eligible applicants must be an elector of the City of Ithaca and shall have been a resident of the City for a period of not less than on year* and must not be in default to the City. Applications will be accepted through May 31st. Terms run from July 1 through June 30th of each year. *Not a requirement for DDA

A Few Tips to Help Keep Our Community Looking Great

- Glass Clippings –Please keep grass clippings away from the street to avoid plugging drains and catch basins.
- ► Tree Trimming and Clear Vision If you have trees or shrubs that hang over the sidewalk, please trim them back to allow safe walkways. On corner lots, make sure any trees, bushes and landscaping are maintained to allow for clear vision for all vehicles and pedestrians.
- ▶ Leaves Please do not rake leaves to the curb during the Spring months. The City does not have a leaf collection program in the Spring as it does in the Fall. Residents may dispose of leaves and yard waste at the City brush pile located on the South East corner of town at the end of Meadow Lane Estates. There are two piles which are labeled with signs. The Southern pile is for the disposal of tree limbs, brush & brush trimmings. The Northern pile is for the disposal of grass, plants (no rootballls), cut flowers and leaves.
- ► Yard/Garage Sale and Political Campaign signs must be placed behind the sidewalk and permission must be given by the property owner before placing the sign. Signs are not allowed on utility poles, street signs, streetlights, trees, or corners of alleys and streets. Please refrain from parking vehicles downtown to advertise sales.
- ▶ Cemetery Decorations New decorations are allowed starting May 1st. Any grave decorations must be within 12 inches of the stone. Glass containers, hedges, rosebushes and/or thorny vegetation is strictly prohibited. All flowers, including artificial may only be placed in an urn. Plantings shall be permitted only under supervision of the Cemetery Sexton. The City will remove all flowers, trees or shrubs which have become unsightly, dangerous or within a walk-way or alley without notice.



Notice to Ithaca Property Owners, Tenants & Public

City code requires that grasses & noxious weeds not exceed eight (8) inches of height on any property in the City of Ithaca. Weeds and grasses not cut by May 1, 2023 will be cut by the City as many times as necessary and the property owner charged accordingly. Please see the city website for complete Property Maintenance Code



Beginning May 8th through May 11th, the DPW will begin flushing fire hydrants. You may experience low water pressure and/or discolored water during this process.
